This data shows outcomes for July 2015.

Closing the Gaps Data shows that some gaps are now closing. This is measured using a point score that shows level of achievement. The points represent a level eg. 27.0 is equal to a 4B. This is a measure of attainment. When the data for Pupil Premium children is compared to that of Non Pupil Premium children, the difference in points represents the gap. This is represented below.

This data shows that in Maths and particularly in Reading, the gap in attainment has closed for this group of children. If we consider the amount of progress they have been making, then we can use a score line where 100.00 is the expected amount of progress.

Again this demonstrates that due to money spent on the academic, welfare and enrichment needs of these children they have made improved progress in Reading and Maths.

Additional impact of Pupil Premium spending in this year have included more children attending residential visits as well as a greater range of children accessing the support of the nurture team.
