LANGSTONE JUNIOR SCHOOL

PROPOSAL FOR PE PREMIUM ALLOCATION SPENDING 2020-2021 and Impact statements

In July 2017, the Government announced further funding for all schools to bring about measurable and sustained improvement for physical education (PE) and sport. This is a ring-fenced lump sum for schools amounting to approximately £19800 this year in our school. The funding will be used to ensure all pupils leave primary school physically literate and with knowledge, skills and motivation to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

In order to achieve this, we will be:

- Procuring quality-assured professional training in REAL PE for staff to raise their confidence and competence
 in teaching PE and sport and allow for some release opportunities to develop staff being able to observe the
 teaching of PE.
- Employing coaches to provide after school and lunchtime sport opportunities to broaden the range of activities for all pupils.
- Subsidising transport and pool costs to provide swimming lessons (Year 3 pupils and those in Y6 who are not yet able to swim 25m), aimed at ensuring opportunities for non-swimmers are provided.
- Buying into existing local sports networks such as school sport partnerships or community sports coaching initiatives
- Providing Fit for purpose/ up to date equipment and an outdoor play and adventure area to promote active lifestyles during breaks.
- 'Nurture Support' provide mental well-being to the most vulnerable, and those who often miss out due to lack of PE kit.

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			End of year impact — Swimming has been organised and both Y6 non- swimmers and all of Year 4 participated in swimming. Where fees have been paid and games postponed have been carried over to the next term. Country wide response to the COVID pandemic interrupted some plans and must remain a priority for when restrictions ease and all sport re- commence.

Increased practical levels of confidence for teaching staff. Raised profile of PE across the school. New activities to engage and motivate all pupils. End of year impact — Most staff have been able to grow their confidence and have implemented new approaches. This will need to continue to be a development programme, especially for continued development. This approach have ensured that the profile of PE was raised. New SSP lead in role — details of plans, and where to sign up to SSP SLA last academic year as this could support CPD and PPA/ After school club cover. It is worth looking into again — to further support and develop.

This will continue during the next academic year as 2 NQTs have been employed and will need further development. Real Gymnastics training planned in and Dance training provisionally planned and paid for through Real Legacy. Real Dance will need to be confirmed. Gym and Dance were identified as areas of subject knowledge weakness and lack in confidence from staff questionnaires and as such will remain of the spend plan.
